What is Advocacy Day?

 bring partners and constituents from across the commonwealth to meet with legislators,
 wear orange shirts and be a visible presence throughout the capitol, and hold a rally,
 filling the steps of the capitol.
- We will be advocating for Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPOs), Secure Storage, Universal Background Checks, Lost & Stolen Firearm Reporting, Ending Untraceable "Ghost Guns" and 3-D Printed Firearms, and \$80 million in Community Violence Intervention (CVI) funding in Gov. Shapiro's FY25 Budget.

Target Districts

- Target Districts are state House districts that are considered high priority to CeaseFirePA for Advocacy Day. This means the elected officials of that district are either "swingable" (i.e. they are Republicans who have previously voted in favor of our Common Agenda items or Democrats who have voted against) or are in a position of power (i.e. member of the Judiciary or Finance committees).
- This <u>Google Sheet</u> has a list of target districts, House members, and the towns/areas represented. Explore this Google Sheet and if you have faith connections in towns listed as high priority, please invite them to Advocacy Day!
 - This <u>website</u> also allows you to explore House districts on a map of Pennsylvania, this may be easier for folks who are visual learners. The site does not include which districts are targets or high priority, so you may need to

reference the Google Sheet as well. Once you click on a county, you will need to check the "PA House Map" square to see the House District breakdown. Reach out to Carla if you have any questions about Target Districts.

Talking Points to consider during Advocacy Day:

- The role of faith leaders in the fight against gun violence: Faith leaders are often
 witnesses to the devastating impacts of gun violence on members of their communities.
 By providing counseling, prayer, and other supports, faith leaders are able to mitigate
 some of the traumatic effects that follow gun violence. However, faith leaders also have
 a strong position in preventing gun violence before it ever happens through policy
 advocacy and power building.
- **Gun violence is a moral issue:** Ending gun violence is a moral imperative. Fatal and non-fatal injuries caused by firearms are devastating to their victims. Additionally, the trauma caused by gun violence has lasting impacts on survivors as they mourn the loss of their loved ones. Life is sacred in every religion. Faith leaders preside over the births and deaths of their congregants, watching gun violence cut a life short too often.
- Investing in safer communities, advocating for CVI funding: Everyone should be able to live, work, play and learn free from gun violence. But in too many of the most under-resourced and marginalized communities, the risk of being shot is part of daily life. It doesn't have to be that way. Cities across the United States are supporting community-led efforts to interrupt cycles of violence, support those in crisis, and provide trauma-informed care. The result: reductions in gun violence of up to 50 percent. Pennsylvania must do the same.

Action Steps you can take before Advocacy Day:

- Sign Up for CeaseFirePA's Advocacy Day in Harrisburg April 8, 2025
- Ask your legislators to support and build upon Governor Shapiro's budget proposal for violence prevention programs!
- Write an LTE supporting Governor Shapiro's violence prevention budget
- Invite as many faith leaders as possible to join us for Advocacy Day! We are stronger together, and it will take all of us to fight gun violence.
