# Pittsburgh Interfaith Pilgrimage for Gaza

Concerned about the more than 30,000 people killed in Gaza, 1200 in Israel, and 417 on the West Bank, Christians and others in 145 cities in 18 countries are planning pilgrimages for peace during Lent. The Pittsburgh Interfaith Pilgrimage for Gaza will start at the Islamic Center of Oakland (4000 Bigelow Blvd.), on Holy Saturday, March 30, at 10 am, and walk in silence, song, and prayer about 1.5 miles to Schenley Plaza outside the Carnegie Library.



Information will be provided about Gaza's history and culture and suggestions for next steps to bring about a lasting ceasefire. This pilgrimage is a nonviolent entering into the suffering in the Holy Land, and also intends to raise money to help refugees, including to provide food, water and medicine through the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees (UNRWA). The Diocesan Social Justice and Outreach Committee voted unanimously to endorse this event.

Bishop Ketlen visited with friends and family at St. David's, Peters Township on Sunday, March 10.


### St. Thomas, Canonsburg

2024 Chrism Mass


