#### **Children's Ministry Spotlight**

With the beginning of fall and school well-underway, it is a fitting time to highlight the children's ministry at work in our diocese. Jennifer Yoon, the diocesan Children's Ministry Coordinator, has compiled a <u>series of helpful resources</u> for parishes and families that includes Montessori-style formation, lectionary-based children's ministry curricula, confirmation curricula and more. The diocese also has a Godly Play materials lending library that is available for use.



Jennifer has been involved in children's ministry in one form or another for the last 23 years. Her journey began at a small Episcopal church in Dallas when, after attending a few times, the priest asked her to lead their children's ministry. With hardly any exposure at the time to the Bible or children's ministry, Jen began a journey of learning alongside children, a posture which has informed her robust ministry to this day. Jen reflects on this journey in saying, "I think there's no better way to learn and form yourself spiritually than working with children and learning alongside them. I am always humbled that God chose me to do this work and be with these children and I pray that the things that we share together stick with them through the years."

By creating a space where questions can be explored together, children can hear the stories of God with curiosity and apply it to their lives and their own understanding in a way that meets them where they are in their development. Godly Play, in particular, adopts a storytelling approach that invites children to wonder about the stories they hear and to express their reflections through art.

Storymakers NYC is another resource which operates similarly to Godly Play in book form. While these are just a couple of resources, there are many more that seek to nurture children in their life of faith.

Children are integral members of the church community, and it is important that they remain a priority in the ministry of the diocese. The work and resources that goes into building ministries for families is substantial, an important thing to remember in planning and envisioning the future. By prioritizing environments where children feel welcome and engaged, environments that foster wonder and creativity, ministries are actively shaping the future of the church.



#### **Historic Religious Properties Grant Program**

The Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation is now accepting grant applications for the 2025 cycle of the Historic Religious Properties Grant program. The only one of its kind in Allegheny County, the program offers matching grants of up to \$10,000 for the restoration and renovation of architecturally significant historic religious buildings, where congregations also provide social services to their surrounding community.



In addition to matching grants, the PHLF also offers technical assistance to qualifying congregations with historic buildings where they assess the condition of the building, review architectural and /or engineering studies, and also provide congregations with advice on how to work with an architect or contractor.

The deadline for the 2025 cycle is December 6, 2024.

On Sunday, October 27, Bishop Ketlen's visitation to St. Matthew's, Homestead, was a joy-filled occasion.




#### The Chapel at St. Margaret Hospital
