

Six Steps to Sanity


Six Steps to SANITY Ministry is a safe, confidential environment that offers support and tools to families dealing with a loved one's substance abuse. The next weekly session is starting at St. Thomas Memorial Church, 378 Delaware Avenue, Oakmont, PA 15139, on Tuesday, February 25 and will run until May 6. Meetings run from 7 to 8:30 p.m. We invite anyone who is dealing with a loved one's substance abuse who could benefit from this ministry is invited.



Six Steps to SANITY is a faith-based ministry and support group adapted from the best-selling book, *Setting Boundaries with Your Adult Children* by Allison Bottke, for people who are dealing with addiction in their families. Using the Study Guide workbook, parents and families will learn how enabling and codependency contribute to addiction. Learning and applying these steps with other parents, spouses or other family members will produce healing and sanity in their lives.
