Overview of Process for former Roman Catholic Priests Seeking Reception of Holy Orders

- 1. Connect with a parish of the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh. Worship regularly and get to know the Rector/Priest in Charge.
- 2. Be received into the Episcopal Church by the Bishop. (12 months must elapse between reception and reception of Holy Orders.)
- 3. Enter into conversation with the Rector/Priest in Charge about your interest, exploring with him or her the requirements/issues outlined in "Guidelines for Reception of Clergy from Other Churches."
- 4. The Rector/Priest-in-Charge appoints a parish evaluation committee to meet with the individual.
- 5. Upon recommendation and request of the Rector/Priest in Charge, schedule an appointment to meet with the Bishop.
- 6. The Bishop may determine to appoint a mentor priest, in which case the individual begins regular meetings with the mentor.
- 7. The Rector/Priest in Charge schedules a meeting with the Vestry to seek approval of a letter of support by at least two thirds of the Vestry.
- 8. The individual collects all of the supporting evidence specified in "Guidelines" and forwards them with his application to the Diocese.
- 9. The individual is interviewed by the Commission on Ministry.
- 10. The Commission and Bishop make a determination concerning a possible internship and additional training as outlined in Section 6 of the Guidelines.
- 11. The individual undergoes such training as required and performs an internship, if applicable.
- 12. The individual is interviewed by the Bishop and Standing Committee to determine acceptability as a priest of the Church.
- 13. If found acceptable, the individual is examined for proficiency.
- 14. The Bishop seeks the advice and consent of the Standing Committee after being satisfied with the individual's theological qualifications and successful examination.
- 15. The Bishop receives the individual into Holy Orders.
- 16. The Bishop assigns a mentor priest to the newly received priest.
